We also temporarily relocated our Eden Prairie Service Center into the Eden Prairie Center, allowing for easy access to funds while shopping. This year, we look forward to opening the permanent service center in a convenient standalone location near the heart of Eden Prairie.

And while we now have a strong presence in Colorado, our commitment to the communities we've long supported in Minnesota, Michigan, Florida, Georgia and Wisconsin remains unchanged. We'll continue delivering the personal service, community involvement and trusted guidance you've come to expect over the years.

## Doing our best work for you

Last year, we continued to support our own Wings Financial Foundation, which raised **\$212,000** through the Financial Literacy Open and **\$47,000** during the Sporting Clays Challenge. We committed **\$275,000** to Volunteers Enlisted to Assist People (VEAP) over three years, awarded **11 scholarships totaling \$30,000**, gave **\$30,000** to Second Harvest Heartland and provided **\$10,000** to The Sunshine Place in Wisconsin. As a combined organization, we'll be able to do even more to help our communities.

The Minnesota Timberwolves fan-favorite recently joined team Wings, thanks to a multiyear partnership. Off court, he'll help design a limited-edition debit card that will launch later this year.
